

PKIKS Celebrates World Aids Day

-Provides 500-Gallon Poly Tank of Safe Drinking Water to Islamic School

Project Kind Initiative for Kids Shoes (PKIKS), a philanthropic intermediary volunteering to promote the livelihood of children, has celebrated World Aids Day by donating a 500-gallon poly tank for Islamic school kids.

Making the donation Tuesday December 1, 2015, the volunteering group Country Director Sekou Dukuly, said the gesture is a response to the need of school going kids who do not have access to safe drinking water on campus.

As direct beneficiaries of the clean bulk water initiative for students, the donation brings to seven the number of 500-gallon poly tanks donated along the Somalia Drive in Gardnersville. Sekou Dukuly, who has also been appointed as Vice President of the Board of PKIKS-International in the United States of America, indicated that the donation is a gesture in response to the lack of safe drinking water for more than 170 kids at the Abubakar Sidiki Keita Arabic and English School in LPRC community.

compassion for our children and their plight to obtain the necessities of life, food, water, shelter and education."

In a statement, the principal of the school, Mohammed Keita lauded the volunteers that the gesture is absolutely overwhelming.

He used the occasion to call on
