A brief history

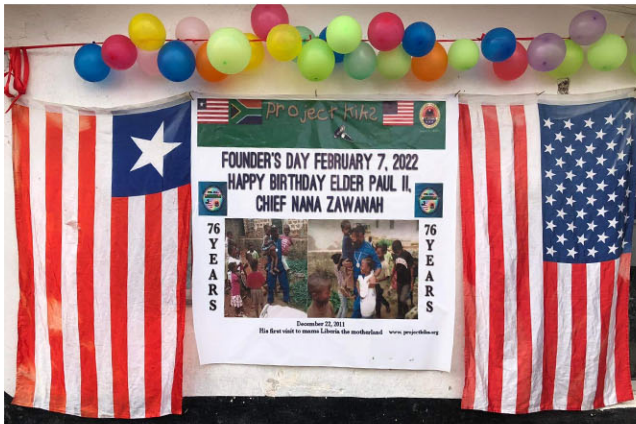
