Liberia is the first nation on the African Continent to gain its independence from the United States of America and the American Colonization Society. The settlement called Christopolis was renamed Monrovia after President James Monroe and the colony was formally called Liberia, "Land of the Free".

On January 3, 1848, Joseph Jenkins Roberts, a free blackman born in Norfolk, Virginia was sworn in as Liberia's first President. On January 6, 2024, Honorable Joseph Boakai, was sworn in as the twenty-six, and current President of the Republic of Liberia. Celebrating 177 years of Freedom.

Between 1989 and 2003, our beloved country was consumed by two civil wars. More than 5000 historical artifacts were looted during this period. Items were often sold by expatriates.
